## **EXHIBITION BOARD GUIDELINES**

The submission for this exhibit will consist of one board of 24" wide by 42" tall. The page composition and content, as well as the number of projects included, are at the exhibitor's discretion. We encourage exhibitors to include images on the board that showcase their role and contribution to the project.

Narratives of the projects are also encouraged. The only restrictions to be observed are the following:

• Board must be oriented vertically (aka portrait orientation). Exhibition boards must be mounted on a <sup>1/2</sup>"thick foam board.

• The design must include the AIA Dallas and LiA logos in the bottom right corner of the board and exactly 5" wide by 2" tall.

• Three lines of black text will be included there, identifying the architect's name (1) UPPER CASE, (2) place of birth, and (3) company. The font to be used will be ARIAL. Please see example below.
